

Camouflage Nature Art

Ages 6-12 · 30 min · Small group (outdoors)

Learning intention

This experience supports children to show respect for the environment and to observe and investigate the natural world.

You'll need

- Paper
- Paint
- Natural materials collected outdoors

How to do it

1. Children write their names on the back of the paper.
2. They collect natural materials from around the yard.
3. Using paint and the materials, they create art that blends into a natural setting.
4. Discuss how animals use camouflage to stay safe.
