

Create Your Own Jigsaw

Ages 5-10 · 20-30 min · Individual

Learning intention

This experience supports children to solve problems and to make meaning from images.

You'll need

- Blank puzzle pieces or paper and card
- Textas and paints
- Scissors

How to do it

1. Children draw or paint a design on a blank puzzle or piece of card.
2. If using card, an educator helps cut it into puzzle pieces.
3. Children mix up the pieces and reassemble their own puzzle.
4. Swap puzzles with a friend to solve each other's.
