

# Walk to the Bakery

Ages 5–10 · 45–60 min · Small group (excursion)

## Learning intention

This experience supports children to develop as active, informed citizens in their community, and to build autonomy and confidence.

## You'll need

- A risk assessment and correct ratios for an excursion
- A small amount of money per child
- A local bakery

## How to do it

1. Walk with children to a nearby bakery, following road-safety rules.
2. Children choose a bread roll and verbalise their order to the shopkeeper.
3. They hand over the money and carry their roll back.
4. A real-world experience building independence and community connection.
